His mother was widowed when he was four years old and this traumatic event would place several difficulties in his path. Mr. Tim left school before sitting the Primary School Examination to help his mother and siblings survive; he would later return to formal education through the encouragement of

Sister Stephen. Upon his return to school, Mr. Tim earned his 1st Teachers certificate and settled into life as an educator and career in this profession. To date he was worked as a teacher, administrator and has been responsible for the establishment and development of many primary schools in the Toledo district.

Mr. Tim has also served as the chairperson for the Forest Home Village from 1958—1994, has served as a facilitator for COMPAR, NOPCA, a donor to HelpAge Punta Gorda, and a founding member of the first Belize Bleeding Disorders Foundation, just to name a few.

In 1944 Mr. Tim was appointed as a Justice of the Peace, and at the age of 76 he can still be seen performing his duties and supporting members of the community.

Ms. Patricia Benguche, better known as Nurse Benguche, is well known in the Dangriga community. A nurse by profession Ms. Benguche has touched many lives during her extensive career. She continue to serve in many organizations that promote maternal and child health

Although formally retired Nurse Benguche has taken on the task of serving elderly shut ins in Dangriga Town. A member of the Charismatic Prayer Group of Dangriga and Associate of the Sisters of the Holy Family, St. Vincent de Paul Society, Nurse Benguche, takes their philosophy of serving those in need, as a personal mandate to serve others. Along with members of the prayer group Nurse Benguche visits elderly shut -ins on a weekly basis.

During these visits Nurse Benguche provides any home care services needed and makes additional visits to home providing demonstrations for care givers or information on the nutritional needs of older persons. In addition to her nursing services she has also assisted older persons to apply for the Non-Contributory Pension. She continues to work for the betterment of her community.

In each settlement or village Ms. Gwen was involved in the life of the community, through training sessions with the Red Cross and organizing feeding programs for school children.

A woman dedicated to the Lord she has been a lay minister at the Our Lady of Guadalupe Church for 15 years. In this capacity she visits the sick in the hospital and performs Communion Service in the villages around Belmopan, but presently she only travels to Roaring Creek. Mrs. Zetina also performs baptismal ceremonies on sick babies when no priest is available.

She was an auxiliary member of the Lions Club and has been a full member for the past 3 years. She has been a member of HelpAge Belmopan for 8 years and also Belmopan Cancer Society. She enjoys contributing to all her voluntary organizations by being a member of the fundraising committees. When not volunteering, Ms. Gwen enjoys gardening and flower arranging. Her knowledge of plants also led her to become a member of the Belmopan beautification committee and the flower show committee at the Agricultural and Trade Show. It seems that wherever there is a worthy cause, Ms. Gwen will be found volunteering her time.

Corozal Golden Age Hero Mr. Roque Bastarachea

Mr. Roque Bastarachea, was born in the village of Patchakan on August 14th, 1933. His love and dedication for his country is reflected in his long standing service to his community.

At the age of 29 Mr. Bastarachea became the first village chairman of Patchakan in the Corozal District. He would serve as chairman for twelve years working to improve the lives of villagers. His interest in the well being and education of the village children was demonstrated in the expansion of the Patchakan school system through the building of class rooms and by ensuring that there were proper streets established in the village, he increased accessibility which enhanced the lives of villagers

At the end of his term as village chairman Mr. Bastarachea continued to be actively involved in the social welfare of the people in the community.

Mr. Bastarachea served as the Assistant Registrar of births and deaths form 1965-2007. In 1974 he became a Justice of the Peace and continues to serve as such in Patchakan. A proud husband and father of three children Mr. Bastarchea continues to contribute to the development of the village of Patchakan.

Mr. Edred Dakers was born on 13th January 1928. At the age of 16 he graduated from Wesley College with a Junior and Senior Cambridge Certificate. At the age of 17 he entered the Public Service as a probationary clerk, this entrance would prove the first steps of his lifetime career as a public servant. Mr. Dakers would raise in the ranks of the Public Service serving his country as Chief Finance Officer in the Ministry of Works, Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Energy and Works and Agriculture and Secretary to the Cabinet.

In 1970, when Mr. Dakers and his wife Alma moved to Belmopan, they became pioneers in the business sector of the budding community. Upon his retirement in 1981 Mr. Dakers opened the doors of Dakers' Stationary and Books and this bookstore quickly became a household name in Belmopan providing school books and school supplies t families.

Both Mr. and Mrs Dakers have served as active members of the Belmopan community. Mr. Dakers as an active member of the Lions Club, and supporting member o the Audubon Society, HelpAge, Red Cross, Cancer Society, the Scouts and his church.

Mrs. Martina worked for many years as a Community Nursing Assistant (CNA) and a midwife. These skills made her well known throughout the village and many expectant mothers sought her out for her services.

The family finally moved to Carmelita Village, where Mrs. Martina once again began to serve her community through health services and delivering babies.

At the age of 70 Mrs. Martina can still be found in Carmelita delivering babies free of charge and massaging expectant mothers to relieve discomfort and ensure the health of the unborn child.
